What would you do with ten dollars to demonstrate your talents?

This past Sunday, in church we heard Jesus' parable of the talents (Matthew 25:14-30), in which he taught his disciples to use and not waste the talents that God had given them to further God's mission. Jesus was encouraging his followers to acknowledge that everything we have – our faith in God, our children, our talents – are not entirely of our own making, but are gifts from God that we must nurture, develop and increase for the sake of God's mission in the world. *All things come of thee, O Lord, and of thine own have we given thee.* In the parable, the master gives one, two or five talents to his servants, *each according to his ability*, and after a long journey returns and asks the servants for an accounting. Those who received five or two talents took risks and doubled the value and returned the increase to their master, who joyfully praised them both. But the servant who had received one talent was fearful of the master and buried his talent to keep it safe. Since his talent was not used, the servant was useless. The angry and disappointed master called that servant, *wicked and lazy* and took the one talent away from him.

What would you do with ten dollars to demonstrate your talents?

It seems that those who are not willing to risk anything for God's sake are actually risking losing everything. God does not entrust much to those who do not put their trust in God. Last Sunday at First UMC, we had a *reverse* offering. The offertory plates were filled with ten dollar bills passed throughout the church pews. Those willing to participate were invited to take a ten dollar bill and creatively utilize them as symbols of their talents, or consider them an incentive to discover or claim a talent not yet utilized. The master in the parable did not give his servants any instructions on how to use them, and so parishioners are to prayerfully consider how they will use them to further God's mission. At the end of April, when Christ will have entered our hearts again, there will be another offertory when those who participated will offer the bills in return, hopefully with a significant increase, or submit an anonymous written account of how they used the \$10 bills. Monies collected will be added to the funds being raised to expand the ministry of our church in this community. The written accounts will be published in the parish newsletter, and may inspire others to use their talents in new ways. Those who were not in church this past Sunday and would like to participate in this demonstration of the gospel message will receive \$10 bills when they come to church. *Trust in God, be all you can be, do what God has called you to do, and make a positive difference in your family, your parish, your workplace, your community or in the world. It can begin with as little as \$10.*

The Fundamentals of GOD'S Economy Are Sound

Greetings in the Name of our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ!
The fundamentals of God's economy are sound! Isn't it wonderful to read a statement like that in times of great economic and financial upheaval in the United States and around the World?
I wanted to take a few moments to write to you today concerning some of the events that have taken place over the past few weeks and months, as well as provide you with some encouragement from the Word of God.

THE FUNDAMENTAL OF GRACE REMAINS AMAZINGLY FREE!

His grace is still amazing! Grace in it's essence means "unmerited favor". In other words, we receive the grace of God in our lives as a totally FREE gift that we cannot earn regardless of how hard we try. The Bible tells us in: Ephesians 2:8 For by grace are ye saved through faith; and that not of yourselves: it is the gift of God: 9 Not of works, lest any man should boast.
For some reason, it is so difficult for people to reach out and simply accept this gift, but this is what must happen for Christ to truly come into our lives. You may have heard the statement, "If it's free, it's for me!" Well, Salvation is free, yet it was not cheap by any means! Christ willingly laid down His life for us.

THE FUNDAMENTAL OF WAGES ARE STILL THE SAME! On the other side of the point made previously, we must also remember that God's wages are still the same for those who would reject His precious gift of mercy as we see in the Word of God: Rom. 6:23a For the wages of sin is death...Of course we know the second part of that verse speaks of the gift of God, but too many people overlook the important first part of this verse because we would much rather enjoy a "gift", than get this "wage".

Why is this important in the discussion of God's economy? It is important because we must recognize as Christians that it is both our duty and privilege to share the Gospel with a world that still needs to hear an adequate presentation of the Gospel. Take time to become acquainted with a simple way to share your faith, backed up by the Word of God. Also, live your faith in front of people that will even lead them to a point of asking you how you can have so much peace in tumultuous times!

I encourage you to share your faith with people in these challenging times. Spiritual doors are wide open, and we have the answer! His Name is Jesus.

As of January 1, we have launched our new expanded role for Liturgists. Each one now reads the Call to Worship, the Collect, the Old Testament (OT) Scripture, and the Responsive Reading from the back of the hymnal.

The OT is always read from the NRSV (New Revised Standard Version). There is a new large print Bible that is in place on the lectern up front and should have a place marker for the page of the OT reading for that Sunday. Or you may want to bring your own Bible, which is fine, as long as it is the NRSV.

Each Liturgist now receives an E-mail during the week he or she will read, which contains everything that needs to be read. So when you sign up on the Liturgist sheet PLEASE include your E-mail address! The liturgist Sign up sheet is located on the small table near the elevator in the Welcome Center. ***Text from The Upper Room Ministries email devotion, January 11, 2012:**

I grew up going to church, repeating memorized prayers, and trying to do right. But it wasn't until I started studying the Bible that I admitted to myself that I didn't really have faith in God. I felt a desire for genuine trust in God. One day in Bible study someone asked, "How do you get faith?" Our leader said that we get faith by asking God for it. She quoted Jesus from Matthew 7:7: "Ask and it will be given to you; seek and you will find; knock and the door will be opened to you."

That sounded simple, but would it work? On the way home from Bible study I decided that I would ask for faith. "What do I have to lose?" I thought. I felt strange not praying a memorized prayer, but I didn't know any prayers for this. That day I prayed for the first time in my life in my own words. I prayed a tiny, simple prayer: "God, I want to believe. Give me the faith to believe in you."

God loves to hear us pray. God doesn't require fancy words or elaborate poetry. There is no minimum word requirement. God wants to hear about our needs and desires. One tiny, simple prayer from us is huge and meaningful to God, who loves to answer our prayers. I know that God answered mine. Go ahead; try it. Just ask. Only good can come of it.

I apologize that I didn't share any thoughts recently and I can only put that down to writers block. The usual outside influences for some reason didn't seem to be stimulating my thoughts. I toyed with putting out a list of resolutions for the New Year, but that is something everyone seems to do. Then on Sunday January 8th, while our choir was singing at an American Guild of Organists Service in Concord NH, with the choir of St. Paul's Church, (Epiphany Lessons and Carols) I got my muse. 12 choir members and some of FUMC were joined with our host choir, clergy, guest organists, and many Concord Christians in a celebration of a Christian Feast that isn't as well known as Advent and Christmas.

It was gratifying having so many of the members of the St. Paul's Choir warmly greet us and make us feel at home. A couple of powerful moments opened up the afternoon, and closed it for me. First, my vocal pedagogy teacher (Ms. Holly Teppe) announced herself as part of the host choir and said she looked forward to my leadership. Following the warm-up, I was humbled to hear her professional praise for our choir and their tone, as well as praise that she got to sing under the leadership of a former student. (Remember teachers; we aren't in this biz for the instant gratification....) The second incident took place at the fellowship time following the service. I had no sooner started to ask Corin Molinaro what she thought, (Corin was a last minute addition and rounded out the Soprano section of Karen Lindsay, and Cynthia Sparks.) than one of the leaders of the AGO walked right up to Corin and share his thoughts. He told her that he was particularly impressed with her poise, her confidence, and the blend of pure choral tone in her AND the choirs singing. She accepted the compliment very well, and was equally honest to my Colleague in sharing her impressions of the service. I am thankful that I had such good ambassadors with me this night.

These incidents were all fully realized on the car ride home with Sue Devito and Corin Molinaro sharing their thoughts. Like the scriptures that laid out the prophecy of Christ as the light of the world, and then the Gospel story of the Magi; their journey like ours is fraught with unknowns. We didn't know what their choir would be like, what the room would be like to sing in, or what we would encounter in the telling of the story. Yet what we received from our servant-hood, was more powerful than we could have thought prior to getting there.

I hope your new year is off to as good a start as mine has been. We don't know what the new year holds in store for us, but we can live our life in confidence that God knows. Like Corin in the prime of her learning years, and my voice teacher seeing the realization of her efforts 12 years prior, we are all on a journey, so let's learn and grow and share our stories.
