PASTOR'S CORNER

Dear Family and Friends of FUMC,

At this year's New England Annual Conference, the Conference Statistician's Report highlighted 21 congregations out of more than 500 churches that demonstrated growth in key areas of ministry, including baptisms, worship attendance, and mission engagement. An update from Finance

Since our last update in March, we have seen an improvement in our financial position. Increased giving and careful stewardship have enabled us to meet the needs of the church, remain current on our Mission Shares to the New England Conference, and even transfer a small portion back into our savings account after earlier drawing upon those reserves.

Through the end of May, we have received \$119,500 for our general operating budget from giving, facility use, and trust income. This amount is 6% higher than expected and very close to income for the first five months of 2025. On the expense side, we have spent \$130,300, approximately \$8,000 more than during the same period in 2025, reflecting rising costs and our commitment to paying our Mission Shares in full.

For the Building, Capital Campaign, and Discretionary Funds, contributions have totaled \$65,650, with all funds being disbursed as expected.

As we move into the summer months, while we typically see reduced expenses from heating fuel and snow removal, vacations can also bring a seasonal lull in giving. We encourage you to continue supporting the ministries of First United Methodist Church as you are able. For those who find it helpful, secure one-time and recurring gifts can be made through our website using Vanco.

Thank you for your faithful support of First United Methodist Church. Please continue to pray that the Lord will provide for our needs and consider how God is calling you to support our church. The impact First United Methodist Church has on our community and throughout the world is only possible because of your generosity of time, talent, and treasure.

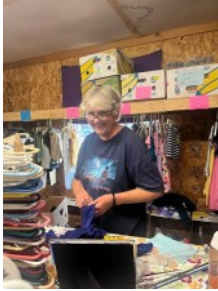

FUMC HERITAGE HAPPENINGS

Rev. Herschel Foster was appointed pastor in 1825, and the cornerstone of the new church was laid with Masonic ceremonies by the Grand Lodge of New Hampshire, on the anniversary of Saint John the Baptist. Hon. James F. Dana was the Grand Master, who commissioned Major Piece P. Furber to conduct the ceremonies. *General Lafayette* being entertained at a public dinner at Dover, the day before, Major Furber invited him to be present and participate in the exercises.

The deputation from Humane Lodge who bore the invitation consisted of Charles Dennett, James Farrington, and John T. Paine. The answer was received in Rochester on the evening of June 23, and was engraved by E.S. Moulton on a plate of copper in season to be deposited under the corner-Stone on the 24th. The following is the answer:

"I much regret the impossibility I am under, in consequence of previous and positive engagements, to attend my brethren of the Masonic Humane Lodge of Rochester at the celebration which they contemplate on the 24th. My heart will be with them, and I beg them to accept my fraternal regard and good wishes. La Fayette"

Another plate of the same dimensions bearing the following words was also deposited:

"Wesleyan Chapel-Erected by the Methodist Episcopal Church of Rochester, N.H., which was instituted 1807. This Corner Stone was laid by Humane Lodge, No. 21, in the presence of many Brethren of the mystic tie, and a large assemblage of people, A. L. 5825. James C. Cole, Secretary."
