And you have found us and brought us home, and we thank you.


And you have sought others in the lost places, in the lonely places, the grimy places, and brought them also to be with us here.



The text is from the Book of Common Prayer to be used at a funeral service at the point in the liturgy where we are reminded of our own mortality and the life to come that restores us to our relationship with Jesus Christ. Henry Purcell was one of the finest Mid-Baroque composer/organist in England. After some early years as a composer of opera and small church works, he was appointed organist at both Westminster Abbey and the Chapel Royal. This work was written for the funeral of Queen Mary in 1695 just months before his own untimely passing.


