
PASTOR'S CORNER

Dear family and friends of FUMC,

bank is now a two story build-

The Rochester National Bank was incorporated in 1874. The Rochester Telephone Company was situated on the second floor of the bank building at one time. Since the Rochester National Bank did not exist until



1874 this would suggest that the first picture had to be taken before that date. Therefor I would propose that we fix the date of the first picture at 1868-1874 or just 1868 for simplicity.

It would be interesting to know when the bank building was expanded to add a second floor as this would help to narrow down the dates even further. More research will be required.

FUNC HERITAGE HAPPENINGS

After doing some recent research on a couple of pictures of our church, I thought it was time to officially put a date on the earliest picture of our church.



This picture shows the church as it was built but we never knew how long it was taken before it was hit by lightning in either 1888 or 1895. Looking at the bank building on the left will give us some clues. This building was built at 22 South Main in 1850. The sign on the bank reads: Rochester Bank – N.P. Savings Bank. According to McDuffee's *History of the Town of Rochester, NH 1722-1890*, the Rochester Bank was incorporated in 1834 and the Norway Plains Savings Bank in 1851.



Recipe(s) of the Month

Apples and Sweets

From the kitchen of Aileen Orchard

2 lbs. sweet potatoes 2/3 cup apple juice 2 TAB. dark brown sugar 2 tsp. cornstarch 1/4 tsp. ground cinnamon 2 TAB. Butter or margarine 1 medium granny smith apple, cored and finely sliced

Pierce the sweet potato several time with a fork. Place in microwave oven on 2 layers of paper towels. Microwave on high for 10-13 minutes for med; 12-15 minutes for large potato, turning every 5-8 minutes, until tender when pierced with a fork.


In a medium microwave safe bowl combine apple juice, brown sugar, honey, cornstarch. Microwave on High 3-4 minutes, stir after 2 minutes, until sauce is thickened. Reserve 1/4 cup of sauce and set aside.

Cut sweet potatoes in half; scoop out flesh and place in a medium mixing bowl. Add remaining of sauce and mash until smooth. Spoon into a 9' microwave-safe pie plate. Top with apple slices. Cover with vented plastic wrap and microwave on High 4-6 minutes or until apple is tender. Remove cover and spoon on reserved sauce over apple. Microwave 1 minutes or until sauce is hot. Serves 6.




